Dear William Dommermuth:

Harris Specialty Chemical was issued a permit on April 24, 1998 for operating a commercial waterproofing materials plant. A letter requesting following changes / clarifications was received on July 27, 1998. The permit is hereby administratively amended with changes marked in bold and strikeout as follows:

1. Richard Hetisimer is no longer with the company and is no longer the Responsible Official. The new Responsible Official is William Dommermuth. His title is Plant Manager.

The above name change is made in effect in Section A.1 as follows:

Responsible Official: ~~Richard Hetisimer~~ **William Dommermuth**

2. On page 18 of 23 of the permit, in Section D.2.5 (a) it references that the daily observations shall be made while the mineral aggregate facilities are in operation. In this section, it should say the observations shall be made while the urethane and epoxy coatings and water based acrylic coatings facilities are in operation.

The section D.2.5 (a) is amended as follows:

Daily inspections shall be performed to verify the placement, integrity, and particle loading of the dust collectors. To monitor the performance of the dust collectors, daily observations shall be made of the particulate matter emissions while the ~~mineral aggregate facilities~~ **urethane and epoxy coatings and water based acrylic coatings facilities** are in operation. Failure to take response steps in accordance with Section C - Compliance Monitoring Requirements, shall be considered a violation of this permit.

3. There is a malfunction report on page 22 of 23. The permit does not reference when this report needs to be completed.

The section C.16 is appended after Section C.15 as follows:

C.16 Malfunctions Report [326 IAC 1-6-2]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 1-6-2 (Records; Notice of Malfunction):

- (a) **A record of all malfunctions, including startups or shutdowns of any facility or emission control equipment, which result in violations of applicable air pollution control regulations or applicable emission limitations shall be kept and retained for a period of three (3) years and shall be made available to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Management (OAM) or appointed representative upon request.**
- (b) **When a malfunction of any facility or emission control equipment occurs which lasts more than one (1) hour, said condition shall be reported to OAM, using the Malfunction Report Forms (2 pages). Notification shall be made by telephone or facsimile, as soon as practicable, but in no event later than four (4) daytime business hours after the beginning of said occurrence.**
- (c) **Failure to report a malfunction of any emission control equipment shall constitute a violation of 326 IAC 1-6, and any other applicable rules. Information of the scope and expected duration of the malfunction shall be provided, including the items specified in 326 IAC 1-6-2(a)(1) through (6).**
- (d) **Malfunction is defined as any sudden, unavoidable failure of any air pollution control equipment, process, or combustion or process equipment to operate in a normal and usual manner. [326 IAC 1-2-39]**

All other conditions of the permit shall remain unchanged and in effect. Please attach a copy of this amendment with the original permit.
