Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation was issued a permit on September 24, 1998 for a stationary pipeline compressor station. ## SECTION A

## SOURCE SUMMARY

This permit is based on information requested by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Management (OAM). The information describing the source contained in conditions A.1 through A.3 is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions. However, the Permittee should be aware that a physical change or a change in the method of operation that may render this descriptive information obsolete or inaccurate may trigger requirements for the Permittee to obtain additional permits or seek modification of this permit pursuant to 326 IAC 2, or change other applicable requirements presented in the permit application.

### A.1 General Information [326 IAC 2-7-4(c)] [326 IAC 2-7-5(15)]

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### A.2 Emission Units and Pollution Control Equipment Summary [326 IAC 2-7-4(c)(3)] [326 IAC 2-7-5(15)]

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This stationary source consists of the following emission units and pollution control devices:

- (a) Seven (7) natural gas fueled reciprocating internal combustion internal engine compressors, installed in 1947, identified as ID #'s 11401 through 11407, with a maximum capacity of 1000 Horsepower each, and exhausting to stacks # S11401 through S11407.

### A.3 Specifically Regulated Insignificant Activities [326 IAC 2-7-1(21)] [326 IAC 2-7-4(c)] [326 IAC 2-7-5(15)]

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This stationary source also includes the following insignificant activities which are specifically regulated, as defined in 326 IAC 2-7-1(21):

- (1) Natural gas-fired combustion sources with heat input equal to or less than ten (10) million Btu per hour:
- (2) Vessels storing lubricating oils, hydraulic oils, machining oils, and machining fluids.
- (3) Blowdown for any of the following: sight glass, boiler, compressors, pumps, and cooling tower.
- (4) Other activities or categories not previously identified:
  - (a) Tank #V5-115 containing pipeline liquids, (Capacity - 2,908 gallons)

### A.4 Part 70 Permit Applicability [326 IAC 2-7-2]

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This stationary source is required to have a Part 70 permit by 326 IAC 2-7-2 (Applicability) because:

- (a) It is a major source, as defined in 326 IAC 2-7-1(22).
