Dear Joseph LaMama:

Chrysler Corporation was issued a permit on May 7, 1998 for construction and operation of an expansion to an automobile transmission manufacturing plant. A letter requesting the elimination of Operation Condition no.7 related to performance testing was received on November 10, 1998. The permit is hereby administratively amended with changes marked in **bold** and ~~strikeout~~ as follows:

The plant has two shot blast units (identified as unit no.6 and 7), each using cut steel wire shots at a blast rate of 7,700 and 5,800 pounds per hour respectively. The particulate matter emissions from the shot blasting operations are controlled by a dust collector with high efficiency (HEPA) filters. These two units exhaust in the interior of the plant.

For unit no.7, the unit has a control device and its allowable emissions would be less than 10 lb/hour. Therefore, compliance monitoring would not be required. Therefore, the stack testing requirement will be deleted. For unit no.6, the unit has a control device and its allowable emissions would be greater than 10 lb/hour. Therefore, compliance monitoring would be required and so the stack testing requirement will remain. The revised Operation Condition no.7 will read as follows:

Performance Testing

7. That pursuant to 326 IAC 2-1-3 (Construction and Operating Permit Requirements) compliance stack tests shall be performed for particulate matter from shot blasters unit nos. 6 ~~and 7~~ within 60 days after achieving maximum production rate, but no later than 180 days after initial start-up. These tests shall be performed according to 326 IAC 3-6 (Source Sampling Procedures) using the methods specified in the rule or as approved by the Commissioner.

All other conditions of the permit shall remain unchanged and in effect. Please attach a copy of this amendment with the original permit.
