Dear Mr. Mee:

The application from Superior Oil Company, Inc., received on 03/13/00, has been reviewed. Based on the data submitted and the provisions in Sections 1 and 2 of 326 IAC 2-1, it has been determined that the following tanks, to be located at 400 West Regent, Indianapolis, Indiana, are classified as exempt from air pollution permit requirements:

- (a) Existing Tank 71, a 1,500 gal fixed roof storage tank located in building B2, will be replaced by a 2,800 gal fixed roof storage tank, to be located in building B2 and identified as Tank 71.
- (b) Existing Tank 72, a 1,500 gal fixed roof storage tank located in building B2, will be replaced by a 2,800 gal fixed roof storage tank, to be located in building B2 and identified as Tank 72.

The Super Blue LF Resin Cleaner that will be contained in these tanks is a water-based surfactant and as such has insignificant levels of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) and Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs). Therefore, new tanks 71 and 72 are exempt from air pollution permit requirements.

The following condition shall be applicable:

1. Pursuant to 326 IAC 5-1-2 (Visible Emission Limitations) except as provided in 326 IAC 5-1-3 (Temporary Alternative Opacity Limitations), the visible emissions shall meet the following:
 - (a) Opacity shall not exceed an average of 30% in any one (1) six (6) minute averaging period as determined by 326 IAC 5-1-4.
 - (b) Opacity shall not exceed sixty percent (60%) more than a cumulative total of 15 minutes (60 readings) in a 6-hour period as measured according to 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9 or fifteen (15) one (1) minute nonoverlapping integrated averages for a continuous opacity monitor in a six (6) hour period.

This existing source received their Part 70 permit (F-097-7395-00286) on 06/05/99. The equipment being reviewed under this permit shall be incorporated in the submitted Part 70 application.

Any change or modification which may increase the potential (pollutant) emissions to ten (10) tons per year or more from the equipment covered in this exemption must be approved by the Environmental Resources Management Division (ERMD) before such change may occur.
