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## SECTION A

## SOURCE SUMMARY

This permit is based on information requested by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Management (OAM). The information describing the source contained in conditions A.1 through A.3 is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions. However, the Permittee should be aware that a physical change or a change in the method of operation that may render this descriptive information obsolete or inaccurate may trigger requirements for the Permittee to obtain additional permits or seek modification of this permit pursuant to 326 IAC 2, or change other applicable requirements presented in the permit application.

### A.2 Emission Units and Pollution Control Equipment Summary [326 IAC 2-7-4(c)(3)] [326 IAC 2-7-5(15)]

This stationary source consists of the following emission units and pollution control devices:

- (a) One (1) shoe dip tank constructed in 1974, identified as EU - 06, exhausting at one (1) stack identified as S/V - 06, capacity: 1,666 units per hour.
- (b) One (1) spray paint booth constructed in 1969, identified as EU - 11, equipped with four (4) high volume, low pressure (HVLP) spray guns, exhausting at one (1) stack identified as S/V - 11 with a dry filter as overspray control, capacity: 429 units per hour.
- (c) One (1) spray paint booth constructed in 1973, identified as EU - 12, equipped with four (4) high volume, low pressure (HVLP) spray guns, exhausting at one (1) stack identified as S/V - 12 with a dry filter as overspray control, capacity: 429 units per hour.
- (d) One (1) asbestos grinding system constructed in 1975, identified as EU - 14, equipped with six (6) grinders, exhausting at one (1) stack identified as S/V - 14 with a HEPA filtration system identified as CE - 14 as control, capacity: 1,800 parts per hour.

### A.3 Specifically Regulated Insignificant Activities [326 IAC 2-7-1(21)] [326 IAC 2-7-4(c)] [326 IAC 2-7-5(15)]

This stationary source also includes the following insignificant activities which are specifically regulated, as defined in 326 IAC 2-7-1(21):

- (e) The following equipment related to manufacturing activities not resulting in the emission of HAPS: brazing equipment, cutting torches, soldering equipment, welding equipment.
