Re: Temporary Operations

On August 15, 2002, Archer Daniels Midland Company submitted a letter for performing a temporary operation at their Logansport Terminal Elevator located at County Road 300 South and County Road 275 West in Logansport, Indiana. The facility recently experienced a fire. There will need to be temporary loading equipment installed in the facility to unload the grain impacted by the fire. The temporary operations will begin on August 15, 2002. The temporary operations will cease on September 14, 2002. Calculated emission estimates of the temporary operations show the emissions to be less than 25 tons of particulate matter.

Applicable Requirements

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3), the above mentioned temporary operation shall satisfy the following requirements:

1. The potential emissions from the operation should be less than 25 tons for the duration of the operation. [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(A)]
2. The operation should not be a major source or modification as defined under 326 IAC 2-2, 326 IAC 2-3, or 326 IAC 2-7. [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(B)]
3. The purpose of the operation is to temporarily conduct an operation not considered as part of the normal operation or production of the source. [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(C)(ii)]
4. The duration of the temporary operation should not exceed 30 days of total operating time. [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(D)]
5. The source shall submit a report containing the following information, seven days after the conclusion of the temporary operation: [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(G)]
 - (a) The actual start date of the construction, reconstruction, or modification.
 - (b) The duration of the temporary operation.
 - (c) The actual emissions occurring during the temporary operation.
