Notice of Decision – Approval

Please be advised that on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management, I have issued a decision regarding the enclosed matter. Pursuant to 326 IAC 2, this approval was effective immediately upon submittal of the application.

If you wish to challenge this decision, IC 4-21.5-3-7 requires that you file a petition for administrative review. This petition may include a request for stay of effectiveness and must be submitted to the Office of Environmental Adjudication, 100 North Senate Avenue, Government Center North, Room 1049, Indianapolis, IN 46204, **within eighteen (18) calendar days from the mailing of this notice**. The filing of a petition for administrative review is complete on the earliest of the following dates that apply to the filing:

- (1) the date the document is delivered to the Office of Environmental Adjudication (OEA);
- (2) the date of the postmark on the envelope containing the document, if the document is mailed to OEA by U.S. mail; or
- (3) The date on which the document is deposited with a private carrier, as shown by receipt issued by the carrier, if the document is sent to the OEA by private carrier.

The petition must include facts demonstrating that you are either the applicant, a person aggrieved or adversely affected by the decision or otherwise entitled to review by law. Please identify the permit, decision, or other order for which you seek review by permit number, name of the applicant, location, date of this notice and all of the following:

- (1) the name and address of the person making the request;
- (2) the interest of the person making the request;
- (3) identification of any persons represented by the person making the request;
- (4) the reasons, with particularity, for the request;
- (5) the issues, with particularity, proposed for considerations at any hearing; and
- (6) identification of the terms and conditions which, in the judgment of the person making the request, would be appropriate in the case in question to satisfy the requirements of the law governing documents of the type issued by the Commissioner.

Dear Mr. Stickler:

Cooper-Standard Automotive, Inc., located at 207 South West Street, Auburn, Indiana 46706 was issued a PSD/Significant Source Modification Permit on April 8, 2003 for the construction of new curing operations (GR-04), which includes eighteen (18) rubber injection molding presses, with a unit ID of 400, each with a maximum capacity of 116 pounds per hour and associated insignificant grinding wheels, with a unit ID of 600, with dust pick-ups that are connected to a header system, which is served by dust collectors that discharge inside the building.

A letter requesting an extension of the 18-month commencement of construction deadline for the remaining sixteen (16) rubber injection molding presses was received on June 17, 2004 due to the potential sale of the Cooper-Standard Automotive Group.

The following criteria were examined prior to extending the 18-month commencement of construction deadline found in 326 IAC 2-2-8 (a)(1):

- (a) A re-analysis of the Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) increment consumption and air quality impacts were made. Modeling Section verified that there are no Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) increment consumption or major growth in the area that may have occurred that would cause significant degradation of air quality;
- (b) No new additional federal and state regulations were determined to be applicable to the sixteen (16) rubber injection molding presses. Therefore, federal and state regulations determined in PSD/SSM 033-15942-0013 issued on April 8, 2003 will stay the same.
- (c) The RACT/BACT/LAER Clearinghouse was reviewed, and there is no control technology found as BACT for rubber injection molding press operation. Therefore, the BACT determined in PSD/SSM 033-15942-0013 will stay the same.

Based on the above findings, the PSD/SSM 033-15942-0013 permit, Condition B.3 commencement of construction which will expire on October 8, 2004 shall be extended to October 8, 2005.

All other conditions of the original permit shall remain unchanged and in effect. Please attach a copy of this amendment with the original permit.
