### Notice of Decision – Approval

Please be advised that on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management, I have issued a decision regarding the enclosed matter. Pursuant to 326 IAC 2, this approval was effective immediately upon submittal of the application.

If you wish to challenge this decision, IC 4-21.5-3-7 requires that you file a petition for administrative review. This petition may include a request for stay of effectiveness and must be submitted to the Office of Environmental Adjudication, 100 North Senate Avenue, Government Center North, Room 1049, Indianapolis, IN 46204, **within eighteen (18) calendar days from the mailing of this notice**. The filing of a petition for administrative review is complete on the earliest of the following dates that apply to the filing:

- (1) the date the document is delivered to the Office of Environmental Adjudication (OEA);
- (2) the date of the postmark on the envelope containing the document, if the document is mailed to OEA by U.S. mail; or
- (3) The date on which the document is deposited with a private carrier, as shown by receipt issued by the carrier, if the document is sent to the OEA by private carrier.

The petition must include facts demonstrating that you are either the applicant, a person aggrieved or adversely affected by the decision or otherwise entitled to review by law. Please identify the permit, decision, or other order for which you seek review by permit number, name of the applicant, location, date of this notice and all of the following:

- (1) the name and address of the person making the request;
- (2) the interest of the person making the request;
- (3) identification of any persons represented by the person making the request;
- (4) the reasons, with particularity, for the request;
- (5) the issues, with particularity, proposed for considerations at any hearing; and
- (6) identification of the terms and conditions which, in the judgment of the person making the request, would be appropriate in the case in question to satisfy the requirements of the law governing documents of the type issued by the Commissioner.

Dear Mr. Barnes:

Marathon Ashland Petroleum LLC, located at 2100 East State Road 28, Muncie, Indiana 47303 was issued a FESOP on March 18, 2002 for a stationary petroleum products distribution source. A letter requesting a change to the permit was received on August 11, 2004 for the installation of the following storage tank:

- (a) One (1) fixed roof tote style diesel dye additive storage tank, with a capacity of 350 gallons and an annual throughput of less than 12,000 gallons. This tank will replace an existing fixed roof storage tank, identified as Tank AA-1-3 with a capacity of 504 gallons.

Pursuant to the provisions of 326 IAC 2-8-10 the above storage tank will qualify as an administrative amendment, as it is an insignificant activity and not subject to any applicable requirements. Therefore, the permit is hereby administratively amended as follows (additions are **bolded** and deletions are ~~struck-through~~ for emphasis):

Item (b) in Section A.3 of the FESOP will be deleted since it will be replaced by the above fixed roof tote style storage tank. However, this new storage tank will not be specifically listed or described in the permit, as it will be covered by item A.3(c). Item A.3(c) generally describes tanks with capacities less than or equal to 1,000 gallons.

A.3 Insignificant Activities [326 IAC 2-7-1(21)] [326 IAC 2-8-3(c)(3)(I)]

This stationary source also includes the following insignificant activities, as defined in 326 IAC 2-7-1(21):

- (a) One (1) natural gas-fired office furnace, installed in 1994, rated at 0.09 million British thermal units per hour.
- ~~(b) Tank AA-1-3, fixed roof tank, diesel dye additive. This tank has a capacity of 504 gallons and an annual throughput of less than 12,000 gallons.~~
- (e b) The following VOC and HAP storage containers: Storage tanks with capacity less than or equal to 1,000 gallons and annual throughputs less than 12,000 gallons.
- (d c) Activities associated with the treatment of wastewater streams with an oil and grease content less than or equal to 1% by volume, including:  
  
Two (2) tanks, installed in 1990, used for treating petroleum contact storm water, capacity: 11,809 gallons..

- (e-d) Process vessel degassing and cleaning to prepare for internal repairs.
- (f e) Paved and unpaved roads and parking lots with public access.
- (g f) Purging of gas lines and vessels that is related to routine maintenance and repair of buildings, structures, or vehicles at the source where air emissions from those activities would not be associated with any production process.
- (h g) Equipment used to collect any material that might be released during a malfunction, process upset, or spill cleanup, including catch tanks, temporary liquid separators, tanks, and fluid handling equipment.
- (i h) Tank 10-5, fixed roof tank, kerosene, installed on January 1, 1949, capacity: 391,734 gallons; Tank 55-10, fixed roof tank, No. 2 fuel oil, installed on January 1, 1955, capacity: 2,174,340 gallons; Tank T-8, fixed roof tank, Transmix, installed in January 1, 1949, capacity: 32,928 gallons; Tank AA 8-1, fixed roof tank, gasoline additive, installed in January 1, 1980, capacity: 7,288 gallons; Tank AA 10-2, fixed roof tank, gasoline additive, installed in January 1, 1991, capacity: 10,368 gallons; Oil/Water Separator, underground tank, oil/water mix.

All conditions of the permit shall remain unchanged and in effect. Please attach a copy of this amendment and the following revised permit pages to the front of the original permit.
