## Notice of Decision – Approval

Please be advised that on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management, I have issued a decision regarding the enclosed matter. Pursuant to 326 IAC 2, this approval was effective immediately upon submittal of the application.

If you wish to challenge this decision, IC 4-21.5-3-7 requires that you file a petition for administrative review. This petition may include a request for stay of effectiveness and must be submitted to the Office of Environmental Adjudication, 100 North Senate Avenue, Government Center North, Room 1049, Indianapolis, IN 46204, **within eighteen (18) calendar days from the mailing of this notice**. The filing of a petition for administrative review is complete on the earliest of the following dates that apply to the filing:

- (1) the date the document is delivered to the Office of Environmental Adjudication (OEA);
- (2) the date of the postmark on the envelope containing the document, if the document is mailed to OEA by U.S. mail; or
- (3) The date on which the document is deposited with a private carrier, as shown by receipt issued by the carrier, if the document is sent to the OEA by private carrier.

The petition must include facts demonstrating that you are either the applicant, a person aggrieved or adversely affected by the decision or otherwise entitled to review by law. Please identify the permit, decision, or other order for which you seek review by permit number, name of the applicant, location, date of this notice and all of the following:

- (1) the name and address of the person making the request;
- (2) the interest of the person making the request;
- (3) identification of any persons represented by the person making the request;
- (4) the reasons, with particularity, for the request;
- (5) the issues, with particularity, proposed for considerations at any hearing; and
- (6) identification of the terms and conditions which, in the judgment of the person making the request, would be appropriate in the case in question to satisfy the requirements of the law governing documents of the type issued by the Commissioner.

Dear Mr. Zondis:

The application from Security Painting Co., Inc., received on December 28, 2004, has been reviewed. Based on the data submitted and the provisions in 326 IAC 2-1.1-3, it has been determined that the following temporary painting and sandblasting service, located at 5651 South Harding Street, Indianapolis, Indiana 46217, is classified as exempt from air pollution permit requirements.

The source consists of the following process/equipment:

- (a) Eight portable sandblasting units, each with an internal nozzle diameter of ½ inch, and nozzle pressure of 100 psig.
- (b) Ten portable Graco air assisted spray pumps.

The following conditions shall be applicable:

1. Pursuant to 326 IAC 5-1-2 (Opacity Limitations) except as provided in 326 IAC 5-1-3 (Temporary Alternative Opacity Limitation), opacity shall meet the following:
  - (a) Opacity shall not exceed an average of thirty percent (30%) in any one (1) six (6) minute averaging period as determined in 326 IAC 5-1-4.
  - (b) Opacity shall not exceed sixty percent (60%) for more than a cumulative total of fifteen (15) minutes (sixty (60) readings as measured according to 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9 or fifteen (15) one (1) minute nonoverlapping integrated averages for a continuous opacity monitor) in a six (6) hour period.
2. Pursuant to 326 IAC 6-4 (Fugitive Dust Emissions) the Permittee shall not allow fugitive dust to escape beyond the property line or boundaries of the property, right-of-way, or easement on which the source is located.
3. Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h) (Exemption for Temporary Operation), the Permittee shall satisfy the following requirements:
  - (a) The potential emissions from the operation are less than 25 tons per year for the duration of the operation. [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(A)]



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- (b) The operation is not a major source or modification as defined under 326 IAC 2-2, or 326 IAC 2-7. [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(B)]
- (c) The purpose of the operation is to temporarily conduct an operation not considered as part of the normal operation or production of the facility or source. [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(C)(ii)]
- (d) The duration of the temporary operation shall be less than 30 days of total operating time. [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(D)]
- (e) The Permittee shall submit written notice containing the following information at least seven (7) days before beginning the temporary operation [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(F)]:
  - (i) A description of the purpose of the construction, reconstruction, or modification.
  - (ii) A description of how the construction, reconstruction, or modification is not part of the normal operation or production of the facility or source.
  - (iii) The dates the owner or operator anticipates the temporary operation to begin, and to cease.
  - (iv) An estimate of the potential emissions and actual emissions increase resulting from the operation.
  - (v) The equipment involved in the construction, reconstruction, or modification.
- (f) The Permittee shall submit a report containing the following information at most seven (7) days after the conclusion of the temporary operation [326 IAC 2-1.1-3(h)(3)(G)]:
  - (i) The actual dates of the construction and operation.
  - (ii) The duration of the operation.
  - (iii) The actual emissions occurring during the operation.
- (g) The above mentioned written notification and report, pertaining to all operations initiated in Marion County, shall be submitted to:

4. Pursuant to Chapter 511 "Air Pollution Control Ordinance", Section 511-503, the source shall comply with the following conditions when operating in Marion County:
- (a) Only wet gritblasting – a system utilizing the simultaneous flow of water and grit under pressure – shall be used in cleaning structures that are in excess of twenty-five (25) feet in height.
  - (b) Gritblasting of structures greater than twenty-five (25) feet in height without protective cloths shall be restricted to periods when the wind velocity is under fifteen (15) miles per hour.

- (c) The premises of the job, and other adjacent areas, shall be broom cleaned at the close of each working day.
- (d) There should be no visible emissions when removing asbestos containing paint.

These conditions are "local only" conditions. They are not enforceable under state or federal law by IDEM or U.S.EPA. Pursuant to Chapter 511 "Air Pollution Control Ordinance", Sections 511-503 and 511-504 of the Revised Code of the Consolidated City of Indianapolis and Marion County, Indiana, these conditions are enforceable by the City of Indianapolis through its Department of Public Works, Office of Environmental Services.

This exemption is the second air approval issued to this source.

An application or notification shall be submitted in accordance with 326 IAC 2 to the Indianapolis Office of Environmental Services (OES) if the source proposes to construct new emission units, modify existing emission units, or otherwise modify the source.
