Dear Mr. Miller:

Koetter and Smith, Inc., located at 8991 Louis Smith Road, Borden, Indiana 47106, was issued a Minor Source Operating Permit (MSOP) No. 043-13619-00054 on July 2, 2001 for operation of a wood mulching and wood chip manufacturing plant. On March 31, 2005, the source notified OAQ that construction had not begun for any of the emission units listed in the MSOP. The source requested an extension to the 18 month commencement of construction time period for the emission units listed in the MSOP.

No new state rules are applicable to this source. This source is not a major PSD stationary source because no attainment regulated pollutant is emitted at a rate of 250 tons per year or greater and it is not in one of the 28 source categories listed in 326 IAC 2-2-1(y)(1). This source is not an Emission Offset major source because no regulated nonattainment pollutant is emitted at a rate of 100 tons per year or greater. There are no New Source Performance Standards (NSPS)(326 IAC 12 and 40 CFR Part 60) or National Emission standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAPs) (326 IAC 14 and 40 CFR 63) applicable to this source

OAQ agrees to extend the 18 month commencement of construction time period for the emission units listed in the MSOP to July 2, 2006. This document further amends the existing MSOP in similar manner:

Minor Source Operating Permits (MSOP) expire five (5) years after the issuance date of the original permit. Therefore, MSOP No. 043-13619-00054 will expire on July 2, 2006. If the source intends to renew the MSOP for an additional five (5) years, the source must submit a renewal application at least ninety (90) calendar days prior to the expiration date of the MSOP (326 IAC 2-6.1-7(b)). Once the renewal application has been submitted, the existing permit does not expire until IDEM makes a final decision on the application (326 IAC 2-6.1-7(b)).
