Notice of Decision: Approval - Effective Immediately

Please be advised that on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management, I have issued a decision regarding the enclosed matter. Pursuant to IC 13-15-5-3, this permit is effective immediately, unless a petition for stay of effectiveness is filed and granted according to IC 13-15-6-3, and may be revoked or modified in accordance with the provisions of IC 13-15-7-1.

If you wish to challenge this decision, IC 4-21.5-3 and IC 13-15-6-1 require that you file a petition for administrative review. This petition may include a request for stay of effectiveness and must be submitted to the Office of Environmental Adjudication, 100 North Senate Avenue, Government Center North, Room 1049, Indianapolis, IN 46204, **within eighteen (18) calendar days of the mailing of this notice**. The filing of a petition for administrative review is complete on the earliest of the following dates that apply to the filing:

- (1) the date the document is delivered to the Office of Environmental Adjudication (OEA);
- (2) the date of the postmark on the envelope containing the document, if the document is mailed to OEA by U.S. mail; or
- (3) The date on which the document is deposited with a private carrier, as shown by receipt issued by the carrier, if the document is sent to the OEA by private carrier.

The petition must include facts demonstrating that you are either the applicant, a person aggrieved or adversely affected by the decision or otherwise entitled to review by law. Please identify the permit, decision, or other order for which you seek review by permit number, name of the applicant, location, date of this notice and all of the following:

- (1) the name and address of the person making the request;
- (2) the interest of the person making the request;
- (3) identification of any persons represented by the person making the request;
- (4) the reasons, with particularity, for the request;
- (5) the issues, with particularity, proposed for considerations at any hearing; and
- (6) identification of the terms and conditions which, in the judgment of the person making the request, would be appropriate in the case in question to satisfy the requirements of the law governing documents of the type issued by the Commissioner.

On October 29, 2007, the Office of Air Quality (OAQ) received an interim significant source modification petition from North Vernon Industry Corporation, located at 3750 North County Road 75 West, Indiana for construction of a new furan molding system. The new furan molding system includes the following emissions units:

1. One (1) pouring and cooling operation, with a maximum metal throughput capacity of 0.5625 tons per hour, using mold wash at a rate of 1,638 gallons per year;
2. One (1) shakeout operation, with a maximum metal throughput capacity of 0.5625 tons per hour, using a dust collector for PM control;
3. One (1) furan mold sand handling system, with a maximum capacity of 0.98 tons per hour of sand, using a dust collector for PM control;
4. One (1) furan mold mixer, with maximum annual usage of 112 tons of resin, 33.6 tons of catalyst, 390 gallons of release agent, and 1,638 gallons of mold wash, exhausting inside the building;
5. One (1) pre-finish station, with a maximum metal throughput capacity of 0.5625 tons per hour, using a dust collector for PM control;
6. One (1) blast cabinet, with a maximum metal throughput capacity of 0.5625 tons per hour, using a dust collector for PM control;
7. One (1) core removal operation, with a maximum metal throughput capacity of 0.5625 tons per hour, using a dust collector for PM control;
8. One (1) coarse grinding operation, with a maximum metal throughput capacity of 0.5625 tons per hour, using a dust collector for PM control; and
9. One (1) paint booth, with a maximum capacity of 1,560 gallons of paint per year, using filters for PM control.


Public notice of the interim significant source modification petition was published on October 30, 2007. The public comment period ended on November 14, 2007. Since there are no comments received during the public comment period, pursuant to 326 IAC 2-13-1(i), the interim significant source modification petition is in effect on November 17, 2007 and expires on the effective date of the final significant source modification permit. The interim significant source modification petition may be revoked after this effective date upon a written finding by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) that any of the reasons for denial in 326 IAC 2-13-1(h) exist or if the final significant source modification is denied.

The facilities specified in the interim significant source modification petition may not operate until the final significant permit modification is issued by OAQ.

The interim significant source modification petition is federally enforceable. Detailed construction and operation conditions will be specified in the final significant source modification no. 079-25476-00018.

PETITION FOR INTERIM CONSTRUCTION PERMIT

Description of the Operation or Equipment:

NVIC currently operates a gray iron foundry that manufactures counterweights for forklifts. NVIC is located in Jennings County, which is classified as an attainment area for all criteria pollutants. NVIC is currently classified as a minor source for hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) and a major source under Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD). The source consists of two plants identified as Plant #1 and Plant #2 which each consist of core making, mold making, sand handling, electric induction furnaces, floor pouring and cooling areas, shakeout units, finishing and painting operations. The finishing process includes grinding and shot blasting operations.

The source modification permit application is being submitted at the same time as this interim permit application.

Potential Emissions:

As illustrated in the Cover Letter and the emission calculations included in Attachment C of this submittal, NVIC calculated the potential emissions of the new furan molding system, and existing emission units, based on published AP-42 emission factors or material safety data sheets. The new furan molding system modification will have the potential to generate additional PM, PM10, SO_x, NO_x, VOC and CO emissions but will not exceed PSD threshold levels.

Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) Requirements:

The source is currently classified as a major source for PSD requirements. This modification will not be subject to PSD requirements because there will not be a significant increase in emissions resulting from the modification. The potential emissions for all changes associated with this proposed modification were calculated at 17.67 tons per year for PM, 10.94 tons per year for PM10, 0.05 tons per year for SO_x, 0.02 tons per year for NO_x, 22.62 tons per year for VOCs, and 14.78 tons per year for CO. As a result, the emissions will be less than the PSD threshold permits limits of:

- 25 tons per year – PM;
- 15 tons per year – PM10;
- 40 tons per year – SO₂;
- 40 tons per year – NO_x;
- 40 tons per year – VOCs;

- 100 tons per year – CO; and,
- 0.6 tons per year – Lead.

Non-Attainment:

NVIC is not located in a non-attainment area. Therefore, this modification is not applicable to any non-attainment permitting.

New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) Requirements:

Pursuant 40 CFR, Chapter 1, Part 60, Standards of Performance for New Stationary Sources, this source modification is not applicable to any of the NSPS requirements.

National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) Requirements:

Pursuant 40 CFR, Chapter 1, Part 61, the new equipment will not be applicable to any NESHAP requirements.

State Rules and Requirements:

Process Operations:

NVIC analyzed each of the new emission units for particulate emissions in order to ensure that compliance would be demonstrated with the process weight rate rule. All units will demonstrate compliance based on the maximum capacities outlined in the cover letter of this interim permit application. It is important to note that the maximum capacity listed for the pouring and cooling area should be based on the metal capacity of one mold. Due to production and multiple capacity restraints, NVIC will only be able to pour metal into one mold per hour. As a result, the following information was utilized to demonstrate compliance with the process weight rule:

Interpolation and extrapolation of the data for the process weight rate up to 60,000 pounds per hour shall be accomplished by use of the equation:

$$E = 4.10 P^{0.67}$$

Where:

E = rate of emissions in pounds per hour; and

P = process weight rate in tons per hour.

Hourly metal capacity = 9,000 pounds

Hourly core sand capacity = 70 pounds

Hourly mold sand capacity = 13,500 pounds

Total process weight = 22,570 pounds / 2,000 pounds per ton = 11.285 tons per hour

$$E = 4.10 P^{0.67}$$

E = 20.795 pounds per hour of PM

Potential Hourly PM Rate = (Maximum Hourly Metal Capacity)*(PM Emission Factor)

Potential Hourly PM Rate = (9,000 lbs/hour)*(4.2 lbs of PM/ton)*(1 ton/2,000 lbs)

Potential Hourly PM Rate = 18.9 pounds of PM per hour

Therefore, the pouring operation is in compliance with 326 IAC 6-3-2.

Opacity:

The source is subject to 326 IAC 5-1-2 (Opacity Limitations).

- (a) Opacity shall not exceed an average of forty percent (40%) in any one (1) six (6) minute averaging period as in 326 IAC 5-1-4.
- (b) Opacity shall not exceed sixty percent (60%) for more than a cumulative total of fifteen (15) minutes as measured according to 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9 or fifteen (15) one (1) minute nonoverlapping integrated averages for a continuous opacity monitor in a six (6) hour period.

Volatile Organic Compounds:

This modification will generate VOC emissions. Lake sand is used under vacuum therefore the binder does not contain VOC. A mold wash is utilized on the pouring, cooling station in order to ease the final mold out of the cope and drag. The mold wash has a VOC content of 10 pounds per gallon (either Isopropyl Alcohol or ethanol). Since this is a fairly high VOC content, NVIC will be accepting an annual usage limit on this material. The mold wash will be limited to an annual capacity of 1,638 gallons per year. The new furan mold system will generate a small amount of VOC emissions from the use of the furan nobake resin. According to conversations with the manufacturer, the VOC content of the resin is extremely small. NVIC has applied a safety factor to the manufacturers' estimated VOC content of the resin and is requesting to utilize a 1.0 pounds of VOC per ton of resin VOC content. Since this modification requires a 4,927.50 tons of metal throughput limitation, the following furan mold system annual limitations: 112 tons per year of resin, 390 gallons per year of release agent, and 1,638 gallons per year of mold wash (either Isopropyl Alcohol or ethanol). The mold wash and release agent are also utilized in the furan mold mixer in order to ease the sand mold out of the operation. The release agent is identical to the already permitted release agent material for Plant #2. The painting operations will be limited to an annual coating capacity of 1,560 gallons per year in order to ensure that VOC emissions are less than 25.0 tons per year. Therefore, 326 IAC 8-1-6 for State VOC BACT will not be applicable.

It is important to note that the standard green sand shakeout VOC emission factor of 1.2 pounds of VOC per ton of metal emission factor is not required to be utilized for the new furan molding system since all VOC emissions have been determined based on MSDSs. Utilizing the above-mentioned VOC emission factor would be inaccurate since NVIC will not be utilizing green sand as its mold sand component.

Hazardous Air Pollutants:

NVIC will continue to comply with the current HAP emission limitations which state that the source will emit less than 10 tons per year of any individual HAP and less than 25 tons per year for any combination of HAPs emitted from the P1-Core making, P1-Filler/Putty Application, P1-Paint Booth #2, P1-Paint Booth #3, P1-Final Inspection Paint Booth, P2-Core Making, P2-Filler/Putty Application, P2-Paint Booth #1, P2-Paint Booth #2. The new furan system is comprised of a furfuryl alcohol based resin which does not contain any hazardous air pollutants according to the MSDS. The MSDS has been included as Attachment D. As a result, the already existing HAP limitations presented in the source's Title V permit do not need to be adjusted.

Emission Reporting:

NVIC is currently subject to annual emission reporting. Pursuant to the source's Title V permit, NVIC will continue to submit the air emissions statement annually.

Air Toxic Emissions:

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-1-3.4 (New Source Toxic Controls), this modification will not modify any projected HAP emission calculations currently listed in the source's PSD/Title V permit. NVIC will retain minor status for single HAP less than 10 tons per year and combined HAPs less than 25 tons per year. See Attachment C.

Stack Height:

326 IAC 1-7 does not apply since potential PM and PM₁₀ emissions are less than twenty-five (25) tons per year.

Fugitive Dust:

Pursuant to 326 IAC 6-4, this source is subject to this rule. Fugitive dust shall not be visible crossing the boundary or property line of the source. Observances of visible emissions crossing property lines may be refuted by factual data expressed in 326 IAC 6-4-2 (1), (2), or (3).

Preventative Maintenance Plan:

Pursuant to 326 IAC 1-6-3, a Preventative Maintenance Plan (PMP) is required for these operations. NVIC currently has a Preventative Maintenance Plan in place and will update the PMP accordingly.

Compliance Determination Requirements:

Testing Requirements:

Testing for the new furan molding system and existing emission units, should not be required as a result of utilizing approved AP-42 emission factors and MSDSs.

Compliance Monitoring Requirements:

In addition to the preventative maintenance requirements, NVIC will comply with the compliance monitoring requirements established for control devices as described in the source's compliance monitoring plan. NVIC will monitor the static pressure drop across each of the new dust collectors daily when its associated emission unit is operating and exhausting to the atmosphere. In addition, NVIC will perform visible emission notations of each dust collector exhaust stack once per day and will record whether emissions are abnormal or normal. NVIC currently has a Compliance Monitoring Plan, which will be updated accordingly.

In the event that a pressure drop reading, visible emission notation or dust collector bag inspection results in an abnormal reading, NVIC will take the necessary steps to correct the abnormalities as outlined in the source's Compliance Response Plan.

Record Keeping and Reporting Requirements:

NVIC will maintain records of the visible emission notations, pressure drop readings, annual emission statement, a Preventative Maintenance Plan, a Compliance Monitoring Plan and a Compliance Response Plan for a period of 5 years.

Federal Enforceability:

NVIC consents to the federal enforceability of this interim construction permit.

If the control equipment on the shakeout, sand handling, pre-finish, blast cabinet, core removal, grinding and painting operations were to be ignored for the purposes of determining the permitting level of this modification, the potential emissions presented in Table 1 would dramatically increase and trigger a significant source modification according to 326 IAC 2-7-10.5. Please permit this modification as a significant source modification.


