Notice of Decision – Approval

Please be advised that on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management, I have issued a decision regarding the enclosed matter. Pursuant to 326 IAC 2, this approval was effective immediately upon submittal of the application.

If you wish to challenge this decision, IC 4-21.5-3-7 requires that you file a petition for administrative review. This petition may include a request for stay of effectiveness and must be submitted to the Office of Environmental Adjudication, 100 North Senate Avenue, Government Center North, Suite N 501E, Indianapolis, IN 46204, **within eighteen (18) calendar days from the mailing of this notice**. The filing of a petition for administrative review is complete on the earliest of the following dates that apply to the filing:

- (1) the date the document is delivered to the Office of Environmental Adjudication (OEA);
- (2) the date of the postmark on the envelope containing the document, if the document is mailed to OEA by U.S. mail; or
- (3) The date on which the document is deposited with a private carrier, as shown by receipt issued by the carrier, if the document is sent to the OEA by private carrier.

The petition must include facts demonstrating that you are either the applicant, a person aggrieved or adversely affected by the decision or otherwise entitled to review by law. Please identify the permit, decision, or other order for which you seek review by permit number, name of the applicant, location, date of this notice and all of the following:

- (1) the name and address of the person making the request;
- (2) the interest of the person making the request;
- (3) identification of any persons represented by the person making the request;
- (4) the reasons, with particularity, for the request;
- (5) the issues, with particularity, proposed for considerations at any hearing; and
- (6) identification of the terms and conditions which, in the judgment of the person making the request, would be appropriate in the case in question to satisfy the requirements of the law governing documents of the type issued by the Commissioner.

Travel Supreme, Inc. was issued a Source Specific Operating Agreement (SSOA) No. S039-18523-00590 on January 5, 2004 for a stationary RV and trailer surface coating source located at 66149 SR 19 Wakarusa, IN 46573. On date August 13, 2009, the Office of Air Quality (OAQ) received an application from the source requesting that the permit be updated to add an insignificant woodworking operation and to indicate a change in ownership and company name change to Forest River Inc., Lifetime Division. Pursuant to the provisions of 326 IAC 2-9, the permit is hereby revised as follows with the deleted language as ~~strikeouts~~ and new language **bolded**.

1. The source name has been changed from Travel Supreme, Inc. to Forest River Inc., Lifetime Division throughout the permit. Below is an example of this change.

2. An insignificant woodworking operation has been added to the permit. This addition does not trigger any new rule applicabilities.

A.23 Source Summary

This stationary RV and trailer manufacturing source consists of the following:

- (a) Surface Coating or Graphic Arts Operation [326 IAC 2-9-2.5]
- (b) **One (1) woodworking operation, meeting the definition of insignificant specified in to 326 IAC 2-7-1(21)(G)(xxx), approved for construction in 2009, using portable baghouses as control, exhausting indoors.**

3. Since Forest River owns many sources within Elkhart County, a source determination was made and will be included in the permit.

A.2 Source Definition

Forest River, Inc.'s Lifetime Division plant (source ID 039-00590) is located 0.6 miles from Forest River Housing Inc. (source ID 039-00611). Forest River owns other plants in Elkhart County, but they are all more than five miles from the Lifetime Division plant. The plants are not part of the same source. The Lifetime Division plant is permitted separately from the other Forest River plants.

Source Determination

Forest River, Inc.'s Lifetime Division plant (source ID 039-00590) is located 0.6 miles from Forest River Housing, Inc. (source ID 039-00611). Forest River has many other plants in Elkhart County, but they are all more than five miles from the Lifetime Division plant. IDEM, OAQ has examined whether the Lifetime Division plant and the Housing plant are part of the same source. The term "source" is defined at 326 IAC 1-2-73. In order for these plants to be considered one source, they must meet all three of the following criteria:

- (1) the plants must be under common ownership or common control;
- (2) the plants must have the same two-digit Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Code or one must serve as a support facility for the other(s); and,
- (3) the plants must be located on contiguous or adjacent properties.

Both plants are owned by Forest River, Inc. Since common ownership exists, the first part of the definition is met for both plants.

The SIC Code Manual of 1987 sets out how to determine the proper SIC Code for each type of business. More information about SIC Codes is available at http://www.osha.gov/pls/imis/sic_manual.htm on the internet. The Lifetime Division plant has a two-digit SIC code of 37, whereas the Housing plant has a two-digit SIC code of 24. A plant is a support facility to another plant if it dedicates 50% or more of its output to the other plant. Neither Forest River plant provides any output to the other plant. The plants do not meet the second part of the source definition.

Since the two plants do not meet the second part of the definition, IDEM, OAQ finds that the two plants are not part of the same source. The Lifetime Division plant should be permitted separately from the Housing plant.

IDEM, OAQ has decided to make additional revisions to the permit as described below. The permit has been revised as follows with deleted language as ~~strikeouts~~ and new language **bolded**:

1. Several of IDEM's branches and sections have been renamed. Therefore, IDEM has updated the addresses listed in the permit. References to "Compliance Data Section" and "Compliance Branch" have been changed to "Compliance and Enforcement Branch". The permit has been revised as follows:

2. The SSOA has been updated from the letter style format to the permit style format, as is now standard IDEM procedure.

All other conditions of the permit shall remain unchanged and in effect. Attached please find the entire revised permit. SECTION A

SOURCE SUMMARY

This SSOA is based on information requested by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Quality (OAQ). The information describing the source contained in conditions A.1 and A.3 is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions. However, the Permittee should be aware that a physical change or a change in the method of operation that may render this descriptive information obsolete or inaccurate may trigger requirements for the Permittee to obtain additional permits pursuant to 326 IAC 2.

A.1 General Information

A.2 Source Definition

Forest River, Inc.'s Lifetime Division plant (source ID 039-00590) is located 0.6 miles from Forest River Housing Inc. (source ID 039-00611). Forest River owns other plants in Elkhart County, but they are all more than five miles from the Lifetime Division plant. The plants are not part of the same source. The Lifetime Division plant is permitted separately from the other Forest River plants.

A.3 Source Summary

This stationary motor home and trailer manufacturing source consists of the following:

- (a) Surface Coating or Graphic Arts Operation [326 IAC 2-9-2.5]
- (b) One (1) woodworking operation, meeting the definition of insignificant specified in to 326 IAC 2-7-1(21)(G)(xxx), approved for construction in 2009, using portable baghouses as control, exhausting indoors.

A.4 SSOA Applicability [326 IAC 2-9-1]

- (a) This source, otherwise required to have a permit under 326 IAC 2-5.1, 326 IAC 2-5.5, 326 IAC 2-6.1, 326 IAC 2-7, or 326 IAC 2-8, has applied to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Quality (OAQ) for a Source Specific Operating Agreement (SSOA) under 326 IAC 2-9.
- (b) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(g), the source may apply for up to four (4) different SSOAs contained in 326 IAC 2-9.

SECTION B

GENERAL CONDITIONS

B.1 Definitions [326 IAC 2-1.1-1]

Terms in this SSOA shall have the definition assigned to such terms in the referenced regulation. In the absence of definitions in the referenced regulation, the applicable definitions found in the statutes or regulations (IC 13-11, 326 IAC 1-2 and 326 IAC 2-1.1-1) shall prevail.

B.2 Enforceability

Unless otherwise stated, all terms and conditions in this permit, including any provisions designed to limit the source's potential to emit, are enforceable by IDEM, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA), and by citizens in accordance with the Clean Air Act.

B.3 Severability

The provisions of this permit are severable; a determination that any portion of this permit is invalid shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the permit.

B.4 Property Rights or Exclusive Privilege

This permit does not convey any property rights of any sort or any exclusive privilege.

B.5 Duty to Provide Information

- (a) The Permittee shall furnish to IDEM, OAQ, within a reasonable time, any information that IDEM, OAQ may request in writing to determine whether cause exists for modifying, revoking and reissuing, or terminating this permit, or to determine compliance with this permit. The submittal by the Permittee does require the certification by an "authorized individual" as defined by 326 IAC 2-1.1-1(1). Upon request, the Permittee shall also furnish to IDEM, OAQ copies of records required to be kept by this permit.
- (b) For information furnished by the Permittee to IDEM, OAQ, the Permittee may include a claim of confidentiality in accordance with 326 IAC 17.1. When furnishing copies of requested records directly to U. S. EPA, the Permittee may assert a claim of confidentiality in accordance with 40 CFR 2, Subpart B.

B.6 Prior Permits Superseded [326 IAC 2-1.1-9.5]

- (a) All terms and conditions of permits established prior to SSOA No. 039-18523-00590 and issued pursuant to permitting programs approved into the state implementation plan have been either:
 - (1) incorporated as originally stated,
 - (2) revised, or
 - (3) deleted.
- (b) All previous registrations and permits are superseded by this permit.

B.7 Annual Notification [326 IAC 2-9-1(d)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(d):

- (a) An annual notification shall be submitted by an authorized individual to the Office of Air Quality stating whether or not the source is in operation and in compliance with the terms and conditions contained in this SSOA.
- (b) The annual notice shall be submitted in the format attached no later than January 30 of each year to:

- (3) Changes in regulatory requirements that mandate either a temporary or permanent reduction of discharge of contaminants. However, the amendment of appropriate sections of this permit shall not require revocation of this permit.
 - (4) Noncompliance with orders issued pursuant to 326 IAC 1-5 (Episode Alert Levels) to reduce emissions during an air pollution episode.
 - (5) For any cause which establishes in the judgment of IDEM the fact that continuance of this permit is not consistent with purposes of this article.
- (b) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(j), noncompliance with any applicable provision 326 IAC 2-9 or any requirement contained in this SSOA may result in the revocation of this SSOA and make this source subject to the applicable requirements of a major source.

SECTION C

SOURCE OPERATION CONDITIONS

Entire Source

Emission Limitations and Standards [326 IAC 2-9]

C.1 Opacity [326 IAC 5-1]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 5-1-2 (Opacity Limitations), except as provided in 326 IAC 5-1-3 (Temporary Alternative Opacity Limitations), opacity shall meet the following, unless otherwise stated in this SSOA:

- (a) Opacity shall not exceed an average of forty percent (40%) in any one (1) six (6) minute averaging period as determined in 326 IAC 5-1-4.
- (b) Opacity shall not exceed sixty percent (60%) for more than a cumulative total of fifteen (15) minutes (sixty (60) readings as measured according to 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9 or fifteen (15) one (1) minute nonoverlapping integrated averages for a continuous opacity monitor) in a six (6) hour period.

C.2 Fugitive Dust Emissions [326 IAC 6-4]

The Permittee shall not allow fugitive dust to escape beyond the property line or boundaries of the property, right-of-way, or easement on which the source is located, in a manner that would violate 326 IAC 6-4 (Fugitive Dust Emissions).

Compliance Requirements [326 IAC 2-1.1-11] [326 IAC 2-9]

C.3 Compliance with Applicable Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(i)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(i), the owner or operator is hereby notified that this operating agreement does not relieve the Permittee of the responsibility to comply with the provisions of any applicable federal, state, or local rules, or any New Source Performance Standards (NSPS), 40 CFR Part 60, or National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP), 40 CFR Part 61 or 40 CFR Part 63.

Record Keeping and Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]

C.4 General Record Keeping Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(f)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(f), records of all required monitoring data, reports and support information required by this SSOA shall be physically present or electronically accessible at the source location for a period of at least five (5) years from the date of monitoring sample, measurement, report, or application. If the Commissioner makes a request for records to the Permittee, the Permittee shall furnish the records to the Commissioner within a reasonable time.

C.5 Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(h)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(h), any exceedance of any requirement contained in this operating agreement shall be reported, in writing, within one (1) week of its occurrence. Said report shall include information on the actions taken to correct the exceedance, including measures to reduce emissions, in order to comply with the established limits. If an exceedance is the result of a malfunction, then the provisions of 326 IAC 1-6 apply.

SECTION D

OPERATION CONDITIONS

Operation Description: Surface Coating or Graphic Arts Operation [326 IAC 2-9-2.5]

Emission Limitations and Standards [326 IAC 2-9]

D.1 Volatile Organic Compounds and Hazardous Air Pollutants Limits [326 IAC 2-9-2.5(b)(2)(B)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-2.5(b)(2)(B), the total amount of volatile organic compounds (VOC) and hazardous air pollutants (HAP), as supplied, delivered to the surface coating operation shall not exceed the following:

- (a) the total amount of VOC shall not exceed two (2) tons per month,
- (b) the total amount of any single HAP shall not exceed eight hundred thirty-three (833) pounds per month, and
- (c) the total amount of any combination of HAP shall not exceed one (1) ton per month.

D.2 Particulate [326 IAC 2-9-2.5(b)(5)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-2.5(b)(5), particulate matter emissions shall be controlled by a dry filter system or an equivalent control device. The source shall operate the particulate control device at all times the surface coating operation is in operation in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications. A source shall be considered in compliance with this requirement provided the overspray is not visibly detectable at the exhaust or accumulated on the rooftops or on the ground.

Record Keeping and Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]

D.3 Record Keeping Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-2.5(b)(3)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-2.5(b)(3), the source shall keep the following records of the surface coating operation:

- (a) the number of gallons of each solvent containing material used,
- (b) the VOC and HAP content (pounds per gallon, as supplied) of each solvent containing material used,
- (c) material safety data sheets (MSDS) for each solvent containing material used,
- (d) a monthly summation of VOC and HAP usage, and
- (e) purchase orders and invoices for each solvent containing material used.

All records shall be maintained in accordance with Section C - General Record Keeping Requirements.

D.4 Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-2.5(b)(6)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-2.5(b)(6), the Permittee shall include with the annual notice required in Section B - Annual Notification, an inventory listing of the monthly volatile organic compound (VOC) and hazardous air pollutant (HAP) totals, and the total VOC and HAP emissions for the previous twelve (12) months.
