Notice of Decision – Approval

Please be advised that on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management, I have issued a decision regarding the enclosed matter. Pursuant to 326 IAC 2, this approval was effective immediately upon submittal of the application.

If you wish to challenge this decision, IC 4-21.5-3-7 requires that you file a petition for administrative review. This petition may include a request for stay of effectiveness and must be submitted to the Office of Environmental Adjudication, 100 North Senate Avenue, Government Center North, Suite N 501E, Indianapolis, IN 46204, **within eighteen (18) calendar days from the mailing of this notice**. The filing of a petition for administrative review is complete on the earliest of the following dates that apply to the filing:

- (1) the date the document is delivered to the Office of Environmental Adjudication (OEA);
- (2) the date of the postmark on the envelope containing the document, if the document is mailed to OEA by U.S. mail; or
- (3) The date on which the document is deposited with a private carrier, as shown by receipt issued by the carrier, if the document is sent to the OEA by private carrier.

The petition must include facts demonstrating that you are either the applicant, a person aggrieved or adversely affected by the decision or otherwise entitled to review by law. Please identify the permit, decision, or other order for which you seek review by permit number, name of the applicant, location, date of this notice and all of the following:

- (1) the name and address of the person making the request;
- (2) the interest of the person making the request;
- (3) identification of any persons represented by the person making the request;
- (4) the reasons, with particularity, for the request;
- (5) the issues, with particularity, proposed for considerations at any hearing; and
- (6) identification of the terms and conditions which, in the judgment of the person making the request, would be appropriate in the case in question to satisfy the requirements of the law governing documents of the type issued by the Commissioner.

Fleetwood Homes of Indiana, Inc. #55-1 & 2 was issued a Source Specific Operating Agreement (SSOA) No. S033-10731-00040 on June 7, 2005 for a stationary recreation vehicle component and miscellaneous woodworking and surface coating operation located at 1119 Fuller Drive, Garrett, Indiana 46738. On September 15, 2009, the Office of Air Quality (OAQ) received an application from the source requesting that the permit be updated to indicate a change in ownership and company name change to Adventure Homes LLC.



SECTION A

SOURCE SUMMARY

This SSOA is based on information requested by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Quality (OAQ). The information describing the source contained in conditions A.1 and A.2 is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions. However, the Permittee should be aware that a physical change or a change in the method of operation that may render this descriptive information obsolete or inaccurate may trigger requirements for the Permittee to obtain additional permits pursuant to 326 IAC 2.

A.2 Source Summary

This stationary recreation vehicle component and miscellaneous woodworking and surface coating operations consists of the following:

- (a) Surface Coating or Graphic Arts Operation [326 IAC 2-9-3]
- (b) Woodworking Operation [326 IAC 2-9-4]
- (c) Degreasing Operation [326 IAC 2-9-12]

A.3 SSOA Applicability [326 IAC 2-9-1]

- (a) This source, otherwise required to have a permit under 326 IAC 2-5.1, 326 IAC 2-5.5, 326 IAC 2-6.1, 326 IAC 2-7, or 326 IAC 2-8, has applied to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Quality (OAQ) for a Source Specific Operating Agreement (SSOA) under 326 IAC 2-9.
- (b) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(g), the source may apply for up to four (4) different SSOAs contained in 326 IAC 2-9.

SECTION B

GENERAL CONDITIONS

B.1 Definitions [326 IAC 2-1.1-1]

Terms in this SSOA shall have the definition assigned to such terms in the referenced regulation. In the absence of definitions in the referenced regulation, the applicable definitions found in the statutes or regulations (IC 13-11, 326 IAC 1-2 and 326 IAC 2-1.1-1) shall prevail.

B.2 Enforceability

Unless otherwise stated, all terms and conditions in this permit, including any provisions designed to limit the source's potential to emit, are enforceable by IDEM, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA), and by citizens in accordance with the Clean Air Act.

B.3 Severability

The provisions of this permit are severable; a determination that any portion of this permit is invalid shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the permit.

B.4 Property Rights or Exclusive Privilege

This permit does not convey any property rights of any sort or any exclusive privilege.

B.5 Duty to Provide Information

- (a) The Permittee shall furnish to IDEM, OAQ, within a reasonable time, any information that IDEM, OAQ may request in writing to determine whether cause exists for modifying, revoking and reissuing, or terminating this permit, or to determine compliance with this permit. The submittal by the Permittee does require the certification by an "authorized individual" as defined by 326 IAC 2-1.1-1(1). Upon request, the Permittee shall also furnish to IDEM, OAQ copies of records required to be kept by this permit.
- (b) For information furnished by the Permittee to IDEM, OAQ, the Permittee may include a claim of confidentiality in accordance with 326 IAC 17.1. When furnishing copies of requested records directly to U. S. EPA, the Permittee may assert a claim of confidentiality in accordance with 40 CFR 2, Subpart B.

B.6 Prior Permits Superseded [326 IAC 2-1.1-9.5]

- (a) All terms and conditions of permits established prior to SSOA No. 033-10731-00040 and issued pursuant to permitting programs approved into the state implementation plan have been either:
 - (1) incorporated as originally stated,
 - (2) revised, or
 - (3) deleted.
- (b) All previous registrations and permits are superseded by this permit.

B.7 Annual Notification [326 IAC 2-9-1(d)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(d):

- (a) An annual notification shall be submitted by an authorized individual to the Office of Air Quality stating whether or not the source is in operation and in compliance with the terms and conditions contained in this SSOA.
- (b) The annual notice shall be submitted in the format attached no later than January 30 of each year to:

- (c) The notification shall be considered timely if the date postmarked on the envelope or certified mail receipt, or affixed by the shipper on the private shipping receipt, is on or before the date it is due. If the document is submitted by any other means, it shall be considered timely if received by IDEM, OAQ on or before the date it is due.

B.8 Source Modification Requirement [326 IAC 2-9-1(e)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(e), before the Permittee modifies its operations in such a way that it will no longer comply with the applicable restrictions and conditions of this SSOA, it shall obtain the appropriate approval from IDEM, OAQ under 326 IAC 2-2, 326 IAC 2-3, 326 IAC 2-4.1, 326 IAC 2-5.1, 326 IAC 2-6.1, 326 IAC 2-7, and 326 IAC 2-8.

B.9 Inspection and Entry [326 IAC 2-5.1-3(e)(4)(B)] [IC 13-14-2-2] [IC 13-17-3-2] [IC 13-30-3-1]

Upon presentation of proper identification cards, credentials, and other documents as may be required by law, and subject to the Permittee's right under all applicable laws and regulations to assert that the information collected by the agency is confidential and entitled to be treated as such, the Permittee shall allow IDEM, OAQ, U.S. EPA, or an authorized representative to perform the following:

- (a) Enter upon the Permittee's premises where a permitted source is located, or emissions related activity is conducted, or where records must be kept under the conditions of this permit;
- (b) As authorized by the Clean Air Act, IC 13-14-2-2, IC 13-17-3-2, and IC 13-30-3-1, have access to and copy, at reasonable times, any records that must be kept under the conditions of this permit;
- (c) As authorized by the Clean Air Act, IC 13-14-2-2, IC 13-17-3-2, and IC 13-30-3-1, inspect, at reasonable times, any facilities, equipment (including monitoring and air pollution control equipment), practices, or operations regulated or required under this permit;
- (d) As authorized by the Clean Air Act, IC 13-14-2-2, IC 13-17-3-2, and IC 13-30-3-1, sample or monitor, at reasonable times, substances or parameters for the purpose of assuring compliance with this permit or applicable requirements; and
- (e) As authorized by the Clean Air Act, IC 13-14-2-2, IC 13-17-3-2, and IC 13-30-3-1, utilize any photographic, recording, testing, monitoring, or other equipment for the purpose of assuring compliance with this permit or applicable requirements.

B.10 Permit Revocation [326 IAC 2-1.1-9] [326 IAC 2-9-1(j)]

- (a) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-1.1-9 (Revocation of Permits), this permit to operate may be revoked for any of the following causes:
- (1) Violation of any conditions of this permit.
- (2) Failure to disclose all the relevant facts, or misrepresentation in obtaining this permit.

- (3) Changes in regulatory requirements that mandate either a temporary or permanent reduction of discharge of contaminants. However, the amendment of appropriate sections of this permit shall not require revocation of this permit.
 - (4) Noncompliance with orders issued pursuant to 326 IAC 1-5 (Episode Alert Levels) to reduce emissions during an air pollution episode.
 - (5) For any cause which establishes in the judgment of IDEM the fact that continuance of this permit is not consistent with purposes of this article.
- (b) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(j), noncompliance with any applicable provision 326 IAC 2-9 or any requirement contained in this SSOA may result in the revocation of this SSOA and make this source subject to the applicable requirements of a major source.

SECTION C

SOURCE OPERATION CONDITIONS

Entire Source

Emission Limitations and Standards [326 IAC 2-9]

C.1 Opacity [326 IAC 5-1]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 5-1-2 (Opacity Limitations), except as provided in 326 IAC 5-1-3 (Temporary Alternative Opacity Limitations), opacity shall meet the following, unless otherwise stated in this SSOA:

- (a) Opacity shall not exceed an average of forty percent (40%) in any one (1) six (6) minute averaging period as determined in 326 IAC 5-1-4.
- (b) Opacity shall not exceed sixty percent (60%) for more than a cumulative total of fifteen (15) minutes (sixty (60) readings as measured according to 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9 or fifteen (15) one (1) minute nonoverlapping integrated averages for a continuous opacity monitor) in a six (6) hour period.

C.2 Fugitive Dust Emissions [326 IAC 6-4]

The Permittee shall not allow fugitive dust to escape beyond the property line or boundaries of the property, right-of-way, or easement on which the source is located, in a manner that would violate 326 IAC 6-4 (Fugitive Dust Emissions).

Compliance Requirements [326 IAC 2-1.1-11] [326 IAC 2-9]

C.3 Compliance with Applicable Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(i)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(i), the owner or operator is hereby notified that this operating agreement does not relieve the Permittee of the responsibility to comply with the provisions of any applicable federal, state, or local rules, or any New Source Performance Standards (NSPS), 40 CFR Part 60, or National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP), 40 CFR Part 61 or 40 CFR Part 63.

Record Keeping and Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]

C.4 General Record Keeping Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(f)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(f), records of all required monitoring data, reports and support information required by this SSOA shall be physically present or electronically accessible at the source location for a period of at least five (5) years from the date of monitoring sample, measurement, report, or application. If the Commissioner makes a request for records to the Permittee, the Permittee shall furnish the records to the Commissioner within a reasonable time.

C.5 Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(h)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(h), any exceedance of any requirement contained in this operating agreement shall be reported, in writing, within one (1) week of its occurrence. Said report shall include information on the actions taken to correct the exceedance, including measures to reduce emissions, in order to comply with the established limits. If an exceedance is the result of a malfunction, then the provisions of 326 IAC 1-6 apply.

SECTION D

OPERATION CONDITIONS

Operation Description: Surface Coating or Graphic Arts Operation [326 IAC 2-9-3]

(The information describing the process contained in this facility description box is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions.)

Emission Limitations and Standards [326 IAC 2-9]

D.1 Volatile Organic Compounds and Hazardous Air Pollutants Limit [326 IAC 2-9-3(2)(A)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-3(2)(A), the combined total amount of volatile organic compounds (VOC) and hazardous air pollutants (HAP) delivered to the surface coating operation at the source shall not exceed fifteen (15) pounds per day.

D.2 Particulate [326 IAC 2-9-3(4)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-3(4), particulate matter emissions shall be controlled by a dry filter system or an equivalent control device. The source shall operate the particulate control device at all times the surface coating operation is in operation in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications. A source shall be considered in compliance with this requirement provided the overspray is not visibly detectable at the exhaust or accumulated on the rooftops or on the ground.

Record Keeping and Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]

D.3 Record Keeping Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-3(3)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-3(3), the source shall keep the following records of the surface coating operation:

- (a) the number of gallons of each solvent containing material used,
- (b) the VOC and HAP content (pounds per gallon as supplied) of each solvent containing material used,
- (c) material safety data sheets (MSDS) for all VOC and HAP containing material used,
- (d) a monthly summation of VOC and HAP usage, and
- (e) purchase orders and invoices for each solvent containing material used.

These records shall be kept for a minimum period of five (5) years, and made available upon request of the Office of Air Quality (OAQ).

D.4 Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-3(5)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-3(5), the Permittee shall include with the annual notice required in Section B - Annual Notification, an inventory listing of the monthly volatile organic compound (VOC) totals, and the total VOC emissions for the previous twelve (12) months.

SECTION E

OPERATION CONDITIONS

Operation Description: Woodworking Operation [326 IAC 2-9-4]

(The information describing the process contained in this facility description box is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions.)

Emission Limitations and Standards [326 IAC 2-9]

E.1 Woodworking Limitations [326 IAC 2-9-4(b)(2)] [326 IAC 2-9-4(b)(3)] [326 IAC 2-9-4(b)(4)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-4(b)(2), 326 IAC 2-9-4(b)(3), and 326 IAC 2-9-4(b)(4):

- (a) The particulate matter with a diameter less than ten (10) microns (PM10) from the woodworking operation shall not exceed one-thousandth (0.001) grain per actual cubic foot of outlet air.
- (b) No visible emissions shall be discharged to the outside air from the woodworking operation.
- (c) The source shall not at any time, exhaust to the atmosphere, greater than four hundred thousand (400,000) actual cubic feet of outlet air per minute.

Compliance Determination Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]

E.2 Methods

Compliance with Condition E.1 shall be determined utilizing the test methods specified in 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Methods 1-4 and 201A.

Record Keeping and Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]

E.3 Record Keeping Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-4(b)(5)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-4(b)(5), the source shall maintain records of the types of air pollution control devices utilized at the source, and the operation and maintenance manuals for those devices. All records shall be maintained in accordance with Section C - General Record Keeping Requirements.

SECTION F

OPERATION CONDITIONS

Operation Description: Degreasing Operation [326 IAC 2-9-12]

(The information describing the process contained in this facility description box is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions.)

Emission Limitations and Standards [326 IAC 2-9]

F.1 Volatile Organic Compounds and Hazardous Air Pollutants Limits [326 IAC 2-9-12(a)(3)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-12(a)(3), the total amount of volatile organic compounds (VOC) and hazardous air pollutants (HAP) delivered to the degreasing operation at the source, less the amount of VOC and HAP quantified by manifest as having been shipped off-site, on an annual rolling average basis, shall be limited as follows:

- (a) the total amount of any single HAP from the degreasing operation shall not exceed eight hundred thirty-three (833) pounds per month,
- (b) the total amount of any combination of HAP from the degreasing operation shall not exceed one (1) ton per month, and
- (c) the total amount of VOC from degreasing operations at sources located outside of Lake and Porter Counties shall not exceed two (2) ton per month.

Record Keeping and Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]

F.2 Record Keeping Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-12(b)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-12(b), the source shall keep the following records for the degreasing operation:

- (a) purchase records for all degreasing solvents,
- (b) material safety data sheets (MSDS) for all degreasing solvents,
- (c) the amount of waste degreasing solvent manifested off-site, and
- (d) a monthly summation of VOC and HAP emissions for all degreasing solvents.

All records shall be maintained in accordance with Section C - General Record Keeping Requirements.
