## Notice of Decision – Approval

Please be advised that on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management, I have issued a decision regarding the enclosed matter. Pursuant to 326 IAC 2, this approval was effective immediately upon submittal of the application.

If you wish to challenge this decision, IC 4-21.5-3-7 requires that you file a petition for administrative review. This petition may include a request for stay of effectiveness and must be submitted to the Office of Environmental Adjudication, 100 North Senate Avenue, Government Center North, Suite N 501E, Indianapolis, IN 46204, **within eighteen (18) calendar days from the mailing of this notice**. The filing of a petition for administrative review is complete on the earliest of the following dates that apply to the filing:

- (1) the date the document is delivered to the Office of Environmental Adjudication (OEA);
- (2) the date of the postmark on the envelope containing the document, if the document is mailed to OEA by U.S. mail; or
- (3) The date on which the document is deposited with a private carrier, as shown by receipt issued by the carrier, if the document is sent to the OEA by private carrier.

The petition must include facts demonstrating that you are either the applicant, a person aggrieved or adversely affected by the decision or otherwise entitled to review by law. Please identify the permit, decision, or other order for which you seek review by permit number, name of the applicant, location, date of this notice and all of the following:

- (1) the name and address of the person making the request;
- (2) the interest of the person making the request;
- (3) identification of any persons represented by the person making the request;
- (4) the reasons, with particularity, for the request;
- (5) the issues, with particularity, proposed for considerations at any hearing; and
- (6) identification of the terms and conditions which, in the judgment of the person making the request, would be appropriate in the case in question to satisfy the requirements of the law governing documents of the type issued by the Commissioner.

Dear Mr. Mullens:

Approval is hereby granted to operate the portable portland cement concrete operation described in Source Specific Operating Agreement (SSOA) No. 097-21386-05301 issued on August 18, 2005. This source is to be located at 7500 S. Perimeter Road, Indianapolis, Indiana 46241, in Marion County. This plant was previously located at 750 Dale Schrier Drive, Brownsburg, Indiana 46112, in Hendricks County, and the site approval was issued on July 1, 2009.

Relocation of this plant must take place within 120 days after the issuance of this decision. This approval supersedes all previous site approval letters.

Advance written notice to the Office of Air Quality (OAQ), Compliance and Enforcement Branch, of start-up is required in order for the OAQ to perform an inspection. The notification shall be submitted to:

If the plant is not operating in compliance with all applicable regulations upon inspection, the plant must cease operation upon notification to you by OAQ staff of such non-compliance. Operations may only resume once remedial actions have been taken and approved by the OAQ.

As part of the relocation application received by IDEM, OAQ, on May 6, 2011, the source requested that the SSOA be updated to indicate a change in the company name to Berns Construction, LLC. The company name has been revised throughout the SSOA as follows with deleted language as strikeouts and new language **bolded**:

IDEM, OAQ has decided to make the following additional revisions to the SSOA as described below. The SSOA has been revised as follow with deleted language as strikeouts and new language **bolded**:

1. IDEM, OAQ has decided to remove all references to the source mailing address from the SSOA. IDEM, OAQ will continue to maintain records of the mailing address. Section A.1 of the SSOA and the reporting forms have been revised as follows:

2. IDEM, OAQ has revised Section A.1 of the SSOA to update the county location and to correct the SIC code as follows:

SIC Code: 4640 3273 and 1611  
County Location: Hendricks-Marion County

Lastly, IDEM, OAQ, has performed the following source determination for relocating/operating the Berns Construction, LLC portable portland cement concrete plant at the Federal Express Corporation property located at 7500 S. Perimeter Road, Indianapolis, Indiana 46241:

### Source Determination

Berns Construction, LLC, will operate a portable portland cement concrete plant on the Federal Express Corporation property, providing concrete used to pave Federal Express's new cargo apron. The project is scheduled to be completed by September 30, 2011. The concrete plant is portable and will move to another location after the project is completed. IDEM, OAQ has examined whether the concrete plant and the Federal Express plant would be part of the same source. The term "source" is defined at 326 IAC 1-2-73. In order for these plants to be considered one source, they must meet all three of the following criteria:

- (1) the plants must be under common ownership or common control;
- (2) the plants must have the same two-digit Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Code or one must serve as a support facility for the other(s); and,
- (3) the plants must be located on contiguous or adjacent properties.

The plants have separate owners, with no common owner, so no common ownership exists.

IDEM's Nonrule Policy Document Air-005 interprets the term "major source" in 326 IAC 2-1(22) which is nearly identical to the "source" definition. This guidance sets out two independent tests to determine if common control exists. The first test, the auxiliary activity test, determines whether one source performs an auxiliary activity which directly serves the purpose of a primary activity and whether the owner or operator of the primary activity has a major role in the day-to-day operations of the auxiliary activity. An auxiliary activity directly serves the purpose of a primary activity by supplying a necessary raw material to the primary activity or performing an integral part of the production process for the primary activity.

The concrete plant will provide concrete, a necessary raw material for construction of Federal Express's cargo apron. However, the concrete is not a necessary raw material for Federal Express's primary activity of transporting items by air. Providing concrete is not an integral part of the air courier process. Since the concrete plant will not be performing an activity that directly serves Federal Express's primary purpose, the first common control test is not met.

The second common control test in the nonrule policy is the "but/for" test. This test focuses on whether the auxiliary activity would exist absent the needs of the primary activity. If all or a majority of the output of the auxiliary activity is consumed by the primary activity the but/for test is satisfied. Less than 50% of the concrete plant's output will be dedicated to Federal Express. If Federal Express were to close prior to completion of construction, Berns could easily move the concrete plant to another customer's location. Therefore, second common control test is also not met. Since neither control test is met, there is no common control and the first part of the source definition is not met.

The SIC Code Manual of 1987 sets out how to determine the proper SIC Code for each type of business. More information about SIC Codes is available at [http://www.osha.gov/pls/imis/sic\\_manual.html](http://www.osha.gov/pls/imis/sic_manual.html) on the internet. The Federal Express plant, an air courier service, has a two-digit SIC Code of 45 for the Major Group of Transportation by Air. The Berns concrete plant has a two-digit SIC Code 32 for the Major Group of Stone, Clay, Glass, and Concrete Products. Therefore, the two plants do not have the same two-digit SIC codes.

A plant is a support facility to another plant if it dedicates 50% or more of its output to the other plant. The concrete plant will be on the Federal Express property for less than six months, so it will not be dedicating 50% or more of its total output to Federal Express. Therefore, the plants do not meet the second part of the source definition.

The two plants will be located on the same property, so the third part of the definition is met.

Since the plants do not meet all three parts of the source definition, IDEM, OAQ has determined that the two plants are not part of the same source.


(herein known as the Permittee) is hereby authorized to operate subject to the conditions contained herein, the source described in Section A (Source Summary) of this SSOA.

## SECTION A

## SOURCE SUMMARY

This SSOA is based on information requested by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Quality (OAQ). The information describing the source contained in conditions A.1 and A.2 is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions. However, the Permittee should be aware that a physical change or a change in the method of operation that may render this descriptive information obsolete or inaccurate may trigger requirements for the Permittee to obtain additional permits pursuant to 326 IAC 2.

### A.1 General Information

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The Permittee owns and operates a portable portland cement concrete operation.

### A.2 Source Summary

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This portable source consists of a Ready-Mix Concrete Batch Operations [326 IAC 2-9-9].

### A.3 SSOA Applicability [326 IAC 2-9-1]

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- (a) This source, otherwise required to have a permit under 326 IAC 2-5.1, 326 IAC 2-5.5, 326 IAC 2-6.1, 326 IAC 2-7, or 326 IAC 2-8, has applied to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Quality (OAQ) for a Source Specific Operating Agreement (SSOA) under 326 IAC 2-9.
- (b) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(g), the source may apply for up to four (4) different SSOAs contained in 326 IAC 2-9.

## SECTION B

## GENERAL CONDITIONS

### B.1 Definitions [326 IAC 2-1.1-1]

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Terms in this SSOA shall have the definition assigned to such terms in the referenced regulation. In the absence of definitions in the referenced regulation, the applicable definitions found in the statutes or regulations (IC 13-11, 326 IAC 1-2 and 326 IAC 2-1.1-1) shall prevail.

### B.2 Enforceability

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Unless otherwise stated, all terms and conditions in this permit, including any provisions designed to limit the source's potential to emit, are enforceable by IDEM, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA), and by citizens in accordance with the Clean Air Act.

### B.3 Severability

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The provisions of this permit are severable; a determination that any portion of this permit is invalid shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the permit.

### B.4 Property Rights or Exclusive Privilege

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This permit does not convey any property rights of any sort or any exclusive privilege.

### B.5 Duty to Provide Information

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- (a) The Permittee shall furnish to IDEM, OAQ, within a reasonable time, any information that IDEM, OAQ may request in writing to determine whether cause exists for modifying, revoking and reissuing, or terminating this permit, or to determine compliance with this permit. The submittal by the Permittee does require the certification by an "authorized individual" as defined by 326 IAC 2-1.1-1(1). Upon request, the Permittee shall also furnish to IDEM, OAQ copies of records required to be kept by this permit.
- (b) For information furnished by the Permittee to IDEM, OAQ, the Permittee may include a claim of confidentiality in accordance with 326 IAC 17.1. When furnishing copies of requested records directly to U. S. EPA, the Permittee may assert a claim of confidentiality in accordance with 40 CFR 2, Subpart B.

### B.6 Prior Permits Superseded [326 IAC 2-1.1-9.5]

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- (a) All terms and conditions of permits established prior to SSOA No. 097-21386-05301 and issued pursuant to permitting programs approved into the state implementation plan have been either:
  - (1) incorporated as originally stated,
  - (2) revised, or
  - (3) deleted.
- (b) All previous registrations and permits are superseded by this permit.

### B.7 Annual Notification [326 IAC 2-9-1(d)]

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Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(d):

- (a) An annual notification shall be submitted by an authorized individual to the Office of Air Quality stating whether or not the source is in operation and in compliance with the terms and conditions contained in this SSOA.
- (b) The annual notice shall be submitted in the format attached no later than January 30 of each year to:

- (c) The notification shall be considered timely if the date postmarked on the envelope or certified mail receipt, or affixed by the shipper on the private shipping receipt, is on or before the date it is due. If the document is submitted by any other means, it shall be considered timely if received by IDEM, OAQ on or before the date it is due.

**B.8 Source Modification Requirement [326 IAC 2-9-1(e)]**

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Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(e), any change or modification which will alter operations in such a way that it will no longer comply with the applicable restrictions and conditions of this operating agreement, must obtain the appropriate approval from the Office of Air Quality (OAQ) under 326 IAC 2-5.1, 326 IAC 2-5.5, 326 IAC 2-6.1, 326 IAC 2-2, 326 IAC 2-3, 326 IAC 2-7, and 326 IAC 2-8, before such change may occur.

**B.9 Inspection and Entry [326 IAC 2-5.1-3(e)(4)(B)] [IC 13-14-2-2] [IC 13-17-3-2] [IC 13-30-3-1]**

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Upon presentation of proper identification cards, credentials, and other documents as may be required by law, and subject to the Permittee's right under all applicable laws and regulations to assert that the information collected by the agency is confidential and entitled to be treated as such, the Permittee shall allow IDEM, OAQ, U.S. EPA, or an authorized representative to perform the following:

- (a) Enter upon the Permittee's premises where a permitted source is located, or emissions related activity is conducted, or where records must be kept under the conditions of this permit;
- (b) As authorized by the Clean Air Act, IC 13-14-2-2, IC 13-17-3-2, and IC 13-30-3-1, have access to and copy, at reasonable times, any records that must be kept under the conditions of this permit;
- (c) As authorized by the Clean Air Act, IC 13-14-2-2, IC 13-17-3-2, and IC 13-30-3-1, inspect, at reasonable times, any facilities, equipment (including monitoring and air pollution control equipment), practices, or operations regulated or required under this permit;
- (d) As authorized by the Clean Air Act, IC 13-14-2-2, IC 13-17-3-2, and IC 13-30-3-1, sample or monitor, at reasonable times, substances or parameters for the purpose of assuring compliance with this permit or applicable requirements; and
- (e) As authorized by the Clean Air Act, IC 13-14-2-2, IC 13-17-3-2, and IC 13-30-3-1, utilize any photographic, recording, testing, monitoring, or other equipment for the purpose of assuring compliance with this permit or applicable requirements.

**B.10 Permit Revocation [326 IAC 2-1.1-9] [326 IAC 2-9-1(j)]**

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- (a) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-1.1-9 (Revocation of Permits), this permit to operate may be revoked for any of the following causes:
- (1) Violation of any conditions of this permit.
- (2) Failure to disclose all the relevant facts, or misrepresentation in obtaining this permit.

- (3) Changes in regulatory requirements that mandate either a temporary or permanent reduction of discharge of contaminants. However, the amendment of appropriate sections of this permit shall not require revocation of this permit.
  - (4) Noncompliance with orders issued pursuant to 326 IAC 1-5 (Episode Alert Levels) to reduce emissions during an air pollution episode.
  - (5) For any cause which establishes in the judgment of IDEM the fact that continuance of this permit is not consistent with purposes of this article.
- (b) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(j), noncompliance with any applicable provision 326 IAC 2-9 or any requirement contained in this SSOA may result in the revocation of this SSOA and make this source subject to the applicable requirements of a major source.

## SECTION C

## SOURCE OPERATION CONDITIONS

Entire Source

### Compliance Requirements [326 IAC 2-1.1-11] [326 IAC 2-9]

#### C.1 Compliance with Applicable Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(i)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(i), the owner or operator is hereby notified that this operating agreement does not relieve the Permittee of the responsibility to comply with the provisions of any applicable federal, state, or local rules, or any New Source Performance Standards (NSPS), 40 CFR Part 60, or National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP), 40 CFR Part 61 or 40 CFR Part 63.

### Record Keeping and Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]

#### C.2 General Record Keeping Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(f)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(f), records of all required monitoring data, reports and support information required by this SSOA shall be physically present or electronically accessible at the source location for a period of at least five (5) years from the date of monitoring sample, measurement, report, or application. If the Commissioner makes a request for records to the Permittee, the Permittee shall furnish the records to the Commissioner within a reasonable time.

#### C.3 Reporting Requirements [326 IAC 2-9-1(h)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-1(h), any exceedance of any requirement contained in this operating agreement shall be reported, in writing, within one (1) week of its occurrence. Said report shall include information on the actions taken to correct the exceedance, including measures to reduce emissions, in order to comply with the established limits. If an exceedance is the result of a malfunction, then the provisions of 326 IAC 1-6 apply.

### Portable Source Requirements

#### C.4 Relocation of Portable Sources [326 IAC 2-14-4]

- (a) This permit is approved for operation in all areas of Indiana, except Lake County and/or Porter County, because of the additional requirements for these specific counties. This determination is based on the requirements of Prevention of Significant Deterioration in 326 IAC 2-2 and Emission Offset in 326 IAC 2-3. Prior to locating in any severe nonattainment area, the Permittee must submit a request and obtain a permit revision.
- (b) A request to relocate shall be submitted to IDEM, OAQ at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of relocation. This submittal shall include the following:
  - (1) A list of governmental officials entitled to receive notice of application to relocate. [IC 13-15-3-1]
  - (2) A list of adjacent landowners that the Permittee will send written notice to not more than ten (10) days after submission of the request to relocate. [IC 13-15-8]
  - (3) The new location address of the portable source.
  - (4) Whether or not this portable source will be relocated to another source.
  - (5) If relocating to another source:

- (A) Name, location address, and permit number of the source this portable source is relocating to.
- (B) Whether or not the sources will be considered as one source. See Non Rule Policy (NRP) Air-005 and Air-006.
- (6) If the sources will be considered as one source, whether or not the source to be relocated to has received the necessary approvals from IDEM to allow the relocation.

The notification by the Permittee does require the certification by an “authorized individual” as defined by 326 IAC 2-1.1-1(1).

- (c) A “Relocation Site Approval” letter shall be obtained prior to relocating.
- (d) A valid operation agreement consists of this document and any subsequent “Relocation Site Approval” letter specifying the current location of the portable plant.

## SECTION D

## OPERATION CONDITIONS

Operation Description: Ready-Mix Concrete Batch Operation [326 IAC 2-9-9]

(The information describing the process contained in this facility description box is descriptive information and does not constitute enforceable conditions.)

### Emission Limitations and Standards [326 IAC 2-9]

#### D.1 Ready-Mix Concrete Batch Operation Limitation [326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(1)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(1), the production from the concrete batch operation shall be limited to less than three hundred thousand (300,000) cubic yards per year.

#### D.2 Opacity [326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(3)]

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(3), fugitive particulate emissions from the cement and aggregate silos shall be controlled by operating dust collectors such that visible emissions do not exceed twenty percent (20%) opacity in twenty-four (24) consecutive readings in a six (6) minute period. Compliance with this limitation shall be determined by 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9.

#### D.3 Fugitive Emissions [326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(4)] [326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(8)]

(a) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(4), the fugitive particulate matter (PM) emissions from all aggregate storage piles, unpaved roadways, and aggregate transfer processes of this source shall be controlled by applying water on an as needed basis, such that the following visible emission conditions are met:

- (1) The visible emissions from any storage pile shall not exceed twenty percent (20%) in twenty-four (24) consecutive readings in a six (6) minute period. This limitation shall not apply during periods when application of control measures are ineffective or unreasonable due to sustained high wind speeds. The opacity shall be determined using 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9, except that the opacity shall be observed at approximately four (4) feet from the surface at the point of maximum opacity. The observer shall stand at least fifteen (15) feet, but no more than one-fourth (1/4) mile, from the plume and at approximately right angles to the plume.
- (2) The visible emissions from unpaved roadways shall not exceed an average instantaneous opacity of twenty percent (20%). Average instantaneous opacity shall be the average of twelve (12) instantaneous opacity readings, taken for four (4) vehicle passes, consisting of three (3) opacity readings for each vehicle pass. The three (3) opacity readings for each vehicle pass shall be taken as follows:
  - (A) The first reading shall be taken at the time of emission generation.
  - (B) The second reading shall be taken five (5) seconds after the first.
  - (C) The third reading shall be taken five (5) seconds after the second reading, or ten (10) seconds after the first reading.

The three (3) readings shall be taken approximately four (4) feet from the surface at the point of maximum opacity. The observer shall stand at least fifteen (15) feet, but no more than one-fourth (1/4) mile, from the plume and at approximately right angles to the plume.

- (3) Visible emissions from the aggregate transferring processes shall not exceed an average instantaneous opacity of twenty percent (20%). The average instantaneous opacity shall be the average of three (3) opacity readings taken five (5) seconds, ten (10) seconds, and fifteen (15) seconds after the end of one (1) material loading or unloading operation. The three (3) readings shall be taken at the point of maximum opacity. The observer shall stand at least fifteen (15) feet, but no more than one-fourth (1/4) mile, from the plume and at approximately right angles to the plume.
- (b) Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(8), the fugitive particulate emissions at the sand and gravel operation shall not escape beyond the property lines or boundaries of the source property, right of way, or easement on which the source is located pursuant to 326 IAC 6-4.

#### **Compliance Determination Requirements [326 IAC 2-9]**

##### D.4 Particulate [326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(5)] [326 IAC 2-9-9(b)(6)]
