Please be advised that on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Management, I have issued a decision regarding the enclosed matter. Pursuant to IC 13-15-5-3, this permit is effective immediately, unless a petition for stay of effectiveness is filed and granted according to IC 13-15-6-3, and may be revoked or modified in accordance with the provisions of IC 13-15-7-1.

If you wish to challenge this decision, IC 4-21.5-3 and IC 13-15-6-1 require that you file a petition for administrative review. This petition may include a request for stay of effectiveness and must be submitted to the Office of Environmental Adjudication, 100 North Senate Avenue, Government Center North, Suite N 501E, Indianapolis, IN 46204, **within eighteen (18) calendar days of the mailing of this notice**. The filing of a petition for administrative review is complete on the earliest of the following dates that apply to the filing:

- (1) the date the document is delivered to the Office of Environmental Adjudication (OEA);
- (2) the date of the postmark on the envelope containing the document, if the document is mailed to OEA by U.S. mail; or
- (3) The date on which the document is deposited with a private carrier, as shown by receipt issued by the carrier, if the document is sent to the OEA by private carrier.

The petition must include facts demonstrating that you are either the applicant, a person aggrieved or adversely affected by the decision or otherwise entitled to review by law. Please identify the permit, decision, or other order for which you seek review by permit number, name of the applicant, location, date of this notice and all of the following:

- (1) the name and address of the person making the request;
- (2) the interest of the person making the request;
- (3) identification of any persons represented by the person making the request;
- (4) the reasons, with particularity, for the request;
- (5) the issues, with particularity, proposed for considerations at any hearing; and
- (6) identification of the terms and conditions which, in the judgment of the person making the request, would be appropriate in the case in question to satisfy the requirements of the law governing documents of the type issued by the Commissioner.

On January 11, 2013, the Office of Air Quality (OAQ) received an interim Significant Permit Revision petition from Digger Specialties, Inc., located at 3639 Destiny Drive, Bremen, Indiana for construction of a new powder coating system, coating aluminum fencing.

A public notice of the interim Significant Permit Revision petition was published in Plymouth Pilot News on January 11, 2013. The public comment period ended on January 25, 2013.

Since there are no comments received during the public comment period, pursuant to 326 IAC 2-13-1(i), the interim Significant Permit Revision petition is in effect upon issuance of this interim approval and will expire on the effective date of the final Significant Permit Revision permit.

Pursuant to 326 IAC 2-13-1(i), the interim Significant Permit Revision petition is in effect upon issuance and will expire on the effective date of the final Significant Permit Revision permit.

The interim Significant Permit Revision petition may be revoked after its effective date upon a written finding by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) that any of the reasons for denial in 326 IAC 2-13-1(h) exist or if the final Significant Permit Revision permit is denied. The IDEM has reviewed this interim Significant Permit Revision petition and has not found any such reason. The facilities specified in the interim Significant Permit Revision petition may not operate until the final Significant Permit Revision permit is issued by OAQ.

The interim Significant Permit Revision petition is federally enforceable. Detailed construction and operation conditions will be specified in the final Significant Permit Revision permit 099-32707-00101.



Description of the Operation or Equipment:

The system being installed is a new state-of-the-art powder coating paint line system consisting of a 4 stage washer unit, dry off oven, powder coat booth, powder reclaim system and cure booth. The washer, dry off oven and cure oven will each have a 2 MMBTU natural gas-fired heating source. The powder coat booth consists of twenty four (24) robotic powder coat spray applicators and two (2) manual powder coat spray applicators. The applicators have a capacity of twenty (20) pounds per hour each for a total Potential to Emit (PTE) of 520 pounds of powder per hour. The application of powder to the parts is at an 80% efficiency thus only 104 pounds of powder per hour will be entering the reclaim cyclone separator. The cyclone separator has a 98% efficiency for recovery which will collect 102 pounds per hour of powder and return it to the spray applicators. The secondary filter system will capture the remaining 2 pounds per hour of powder before discharging the air back into the recovery room as fresh air for the booth system. In essence all overspray from powder coat booth will be recovered and reused. The only true emissions will be from the natural gas process heaters and building heater.

Potential to Emit:

Particulate Matter

Before Controls

26 spray units @ 20 lbs/hr = 520 lbs

Transfer efficiency to parts = 80%

520lbs/hr – (520 lbs/hr X 0.80) = 104 lbs/hr emitted

8760 hrs/year x 104 lbs/hr = 911,040 pounds per year

(911,040 lbs/year) / (2,000 lbs/ton) = 455.52 Tons PTE/Year

PSD Requirements:

Digger Systems, Inc. will limit particulate matter emissions by the use of the reclaim system being required to be in operation at all times the spray booth system is operational thus rendering PSD rules not applicable.

NSPS Requirements:

There is no NSPS rule applicable to this operation or equipment.

NESHAP Requirements:

There is no NESHAP rule applicable to this operation or equipment.

- (a) The powder coating booths are not subject to Subpart HHHHHH because the powder coating booths do not use any coatings that contain compounds of chromium (Cr), lead (Pb), manganese (Mn), nickel (Ni), or cadmium (Cd). In addition, powder coating does not meet the definition of spray-applied surface coating operation pursuant to 63.11180.
- (b) The requirements of the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Surface Coating of Miscellaneous Metal Parts and Products (40 CFR 63.3880, Subpart MMMM (4M)) are not included for this source because it is not a major source for HAPs.
- (c) The requirements of the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Area Source Standards for Nine Metal Fabrication and Finishing Source Categories (40 CFR 63, Subpart XXXXXX (6X)), are not included because the facility is not one of the nine source categories listed in 40 CFR 63.11514(a).

State Rules & Requirements:**326 IAC 2-4.1 (Major Sources of Hazardous Air Pollutants HAP))**

The operation of this stationary aluminum fencing railing manufacturing operation will emit less than 10 tons per year of a single HAP or 25 tons per year of a combination of HAPs. Therefore, 326 IAC 2-4.1 does not apply.

326 IAC 5-1 (Opacity Limitations)

Pursuant to 326 IAC 5-1-2 (Opacity Limitations), except as provided in 326 IAC 5-1-3 (Temporary Exemptions), opacity shall meet the following, unless otherwise stated in the permit:

- (a) Opacity shall not exceed an average of forty percent (40%) in any one (1) six (6) minute averaging period as determined in 326 IAC 5-1-4.
- (b) Opacity shall not exceed sixty percent (60%) for more than a cumulative total of fifteen (15) minutes (sixty (60) readings as measured according to 40 CFR 60, Appendix A, Method 9 or fifteen (15) one (1) minute non-overlapping integrated averages for a continuous opacity monitor) in a six (6) hour period.

326 IAC 2-6 (Emission Reporting)

This source is not subject to 326 IAC 2-6 (Emission Reporting) because it is not required to have an operating permit pursuant to 326 IAC 2-7 (Part 70); it is not located in Lake, Porter, or LaPorte County, and its potential to emit lead is less than 5 tons per year. Therefore, this rule does not apply.

326 IAC 2-7-1(39) Natural Gas Units

The unlimited potential to emit greenhouse gases from the entire source is less than 100,000 tons of CO₂e per year.

326 IAC 6-2 (Particulate Emission Limitations for Source of Indirect Heating)

This rule is not applicable to the natural gas-fired combustion units because they are not sources of indirect heating. Therefore, the requirements of 326 IAC 6-2-4 do not apply to the natural gas fired combustion units.

326 IAC 6-3 (Particulate Emission Limitations for Manufacturing Processes)

Pursuant to 326 IAC 6-3 the allowable particulate emission rate (E) from the powder coating booth shall not exceed $E=4.10P^{0.67}$ pounds per hour when operating the powder coating booth at a process weight (P) of 520 pounds per hour.

326 IAC 6-3-1(b)(14), the natural gas-fired combustion units are not subject to the requirements to 326 IAC 6-3-2 because they each have potential PM emissions less than 0.551 pounds per hour

326 IAC 6-4 (Fugitive Dust Emissions Limitations)

This rule requires that the source not allow fugitive dust to escape beyond the property line or boundaries of the property, right-of-way, or easement on which the source is located, in a manner that would violate 326 IAC 6-4 (Fugitive Dust Emissions).

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326 IAC 6.5 PM (Limitations Except Lake County)

This source is not subject to 326 IAC 6.5 because it is not located in one of the following counties: Clark, Dubois, Marion, St. Joseph, Vanderburgh or Vigo.

326 IAC 6.8 PM (Limitations for Lake County)

This source is not subject to 326 IAC 6.8 because it is not located in Lake County.

326 IAC 7-1.1 (Sulfur Dioxide Emissions Limitations)

The natural gas-fired combustion units are not subject to the requirements of 326 IAC 7-1.1 because they each have potential SO2 emissions of less than 25 tons per year.

326 IAC 8-1-6 (New Facilities; General Reduction Requirements)


The facilities at this source have the potential to emit less than 25 tons per year VOC, therefore they are not subject to 326 IAC 8-1-6.

Notice is hereby given that the above company located at 3639 Destiny Drive, Bremen, Indiana, has made application to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM), Office of Air Quality (OAQ) for an interim permit to construct a Powder Coating Line with a cyclone reclaim unit and filter system as air pollution control. Based on 8,760 hours per year of operation, the particulate matter (PM) emissions are 0.2 tons per year, respectively *after controls*.

The company has submitted an application for a significant permit revision / significant source modification. The OAQ shall review the application in accordance with the Permit Review Rules. Operation of the source cannot commence until a valid operating permit is issued. The construction of the proposed project is entirely at the applicant's own risk.

Notice is hereby given that there will be a period of 14 days from the date of publication of this notice during which any interested person may comment on why this interim permit should or should not be issued. Appropriate comments should be related to air quality issues, interpretation of the applicable state and federal rules, calculations made, technical issues, or the effect that the operation of this facility would have on any aggrieved individuals. 
